Earn College Credit Now

You can get a head start on college by earning college credit while still in high school. There are several programs designed to allow you to try college-level work. You could save time and money in college, increase your subject knowledge, gain valuable skills and improve your study habits.



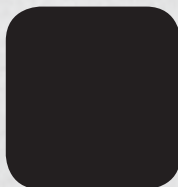
Concurrent Enrollment allows high school juniors and seniors to earn college credit while in high school by taking college courses. Students must meet certain policy requirements to be eligible for concurrent enrollment. These classes are taken at the college or university.



Advanced Placement (AP) Courses allow students to take college-level course work in high school and possibly receive credit from colleges and universities. AP courses are a great way to prepare for college and to boost your number of credit hours before entering college. These classes are taken at the high school. See your high school counselor for more information.



Cooperative Alliance Project allows high school juniors and seniors to enroll in college level courses as part of a cooperative alliance between many public higher education institutions and technology centers statewide. These college credit courses become part of the student's permanent college transcript. There is free tuition for the courses taught by the technology center, but a minimal fee is charged to cover costs. These classes are taken at the technology center. See your high school counselor for more information.



College-Level Examination Program (CLEP) is a series of examinations that allow individuals to earn college credit for what they know, regardless of where they learned it. CLEP is the most widely accepted credit-by-examination program in the United States. The CLEP examinations are administered in the Assessment Center.
