

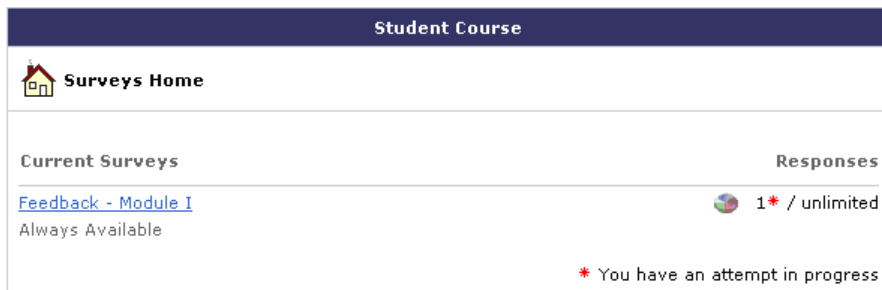
Giving feedback using a Survey

To access the Surveys page, click the **Surveys** link on the right side of your Course Home navigation bar.




The Surveys page displays.
