

OSU-Okmulgee Presidents' Roundtable Minutes

May 2, 2007

Meeting called to order at 11:44 a.m.

Bruce Force welcomed first time attendees to the Presidents' Roundtable and asked them to introduce themselves: Haci Ulucesme, Lukasz Jarochoowski, Tania Walker, Karla LaMunyon, Zac Miller and Ron Hoggard.

Force made some announcements and reminders:

- There is a Mental Health Awareness function currently in the Student Union Mall area where students can take a depression screening and obtain resources about mental health issues.
- Please continue to remember as best you can to get your paperwork in on time – Activity Requests, Trip Insurance at least 24 hours in advance.
- Gas prices are up, so budget accordingly and do as much advanced planning as possible.
 - Art Visconti: Has the price gone up to lease a car from the Motor Pool?
 - Force: Not yet, but Ken Morris is looking at it, because the campus buys gas in bulk and well in advance. If the price of vehicle rent does go up, it will be in the fall.
 - Felix Cuellar, who will have to leave the meeting early, asked to make an inquiry out of the usual order: Would Presidents' Roundtable support a discussion about fixing a campus-wide lunch hour?
 - Force: A good place to begin that process is with the Student Senate.
- Clubs and organizations looking for volunteer opportunities will want to look into helping at Scholars Enrollment Day scheduled one week from Friday. There will be 90-100 kids coming to campus to enroll in all programs, so your club members might want to match up with scholars coming into their programs. Volunteers are needed from 8:30 to noon.
 - Visconti: What will they be doing?
 - Force: Facilitating discussions, taking students to departments, lunch is included.
 - Devin DeBock: They will be grouping by department for leadership/mentoring in the fall.
 - Force: IT students will want to have volunteers from AITP, etc. This is a good recruitment opportunity for clubs/organizations. Contact me with names of those wanting to volunteer. May 11, 8 am, Covelle Hall.
 - Cuellar: Will a list of student names be sent to division chairs?
 - Force: Yes. Most of the work will be done before they get here. Thinks lunch is in the State Room. They will tour campus and the dorms, and allowed to bring up to two guests with them. There are 92 scholarships. RSVPs will be forthcoming.
 - DeBock: The students in this group are high achievers, good recruits.
