Meeting called to order at 11:44 a.m.

Bruce Force thanked everyone who helped with Move-In Day, and welcomed first time attendees to the Presidents' Roundtable asking them to introduce themselves: Kristen Carpenter, BCM.

Bruce Force relayed some announcements:

Force held a club/organization advisor training session during the week between semesters, and had handouts available for those who missed the presentation. Advisors wanting a club P-card need to contact Pat Singleton, Purchasing, to register for any upcoming mandatory training session.

All clubs/organizations must submit updated registration forms to Student Life each September. These forms must be received in the Student Life Office by September 20 for clubs/organizations to participate in the fee allocation process. New club officers need to sign club signature cards in the accounting office. See Karen Moore.

Fee Allocation forms must be submitted to the Student Life Office by September 20, also. The discussions will be held the last week of September. This is a student driven process, and Force is there only to give guidance and keep the process fair and impartial. The Fee Allocation Committee will need two representatives to serve as committee members from the Student Government Association and one representative from RHA, PTK, SNA, ACR, ADDA, AITP, C3 and FAD. The process usually lasts three days and most probably will be Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday, 4:30 - 6:30 pm. Committee members must be able to attend all three meetings. Matt Davis said advisors might want to use their best member to do their own club's presentation. Discussion indicated that new students would serve well as committee members. Presentations last about 15 minutes. Advisors are allowed to be present, but not presenters. Forms can be found on the Student Life Web page under "download forms." Art Visconti asked when the funds would be released. Force indicated it would be before Carnifall.

Welcome Back Lunch is scheduled Wednesday, September 12, 11 am – 1 pm. Clubs/organizations wishing to have a recruitment table during that time must submit an activity request by 4:30 pm, Monday, September 10. Community businesses also will man tables and distribute giveaways. There also will be a blues band and funny t-shirts at the luncheon.

Clubs/organizations that would like to help with voter registration during Constitution Day, September 17, contact Force. The day also will include other activities such as a Sidewalk Chalk Contest. Student Life will provide a pizza lunch if the winner of the contest is a club.

Carnifall is scheduled Thursday, October 25, one week after Alcohol Awareness Week. Participating clubs/organizations must submit Activity Requests stating how many tables/chairs are needed as well as the activity/fundraiser they wish to reserve by 4:30 pm, Wednesday, October 3.
