

**OSU-Okmulgee Presidents' Roundtable Minutes**  
**May 7, 2008**  
**Student Union**

Meeting called to order at 11:44 a.m.

Bruce Force welcomed first time attendees to the Presidents' Roundtable asking them to introduce themselves: Construction Technology Instructor Aaron Gaddy, C<sup>3</sup>; TRiO Director Tim Kreps and Terra Beavers, NASA.

Bruce Force relayed some announcements:

Force made a few announcements: Student Life semester calendars are due out next week. Because of over crowding during the summer semester there are two graduations this semester – Auto/HEVi on Friday, August 22 and all other departments of Saturday, August 23. He mentioned a new law coming that has a limit of no more than a certain amount of people per square foot of space and we do not want to put a limit on how many guests a graduate can invite to their graduation. Advisors are encouraged to continue submitting Activity Requests in a timely manner, and to plan for their club's activities well in advance. There will be no extracurricular club activities the last two weeks of the semester – pre-finals and finals week. Regular meetings are fine, but no extra meetings or activities.

Magen Davis went on to announce upcoming Student Life activities:

There was a good turnout for Cinco de Mayo President's Ice Cream Social.

Force added that information included on the Student Life semester calendar can be found online on our home page until the four month calendars arrive. Also, on another note, he plans to have an advisor training over a lunch hour this summer. He will contact advisors to let them know when.

Kevin Montequé spoke next about wellness classes and intramural sports. The Intramural Soccer Meeting is scheduled 4 pm, tomorrow. Play begins on Tuesday. Body Mass Index Testing is scheduled on Friday, 9 am – 2 pm. There will be a Strongman Competition this semester, which will include contests in discus throw and shot put and a run of some sort. The meeting for that is May 29. Exercise classes include are suspended at the moment to assess demand and potential class times. We hope that will be worked out soon. Aaron Gaddy asked if the Strongman Competition would include a Bus Pull or Keg Throw. Among laughter, Montequé replied in the negative.

Force added that Covelle Hall's Summer Semester hours are 6 am to 8:30 pm, Monday through Thursday; 6 am to 4 pm, on Fridays; and Saturday, noon to five. Covelle Hall will be closed on Sundays. Devin asked if Student Life staff will look at the floor plan of South Wellness, stating the elliptical is set sideways in right front of the treadmills and he felt uncomfortable with that as he used the equipment.

Good of the order:

Haci Ulucesme, MISA: Members recently hosted campus tours; worked with the local Rotary Club; are working on a design for t-shirts; attended a retiree luncheon and the Cinco de Mayo President's Ice Cream Social. They want to be more active in the Okmulgee community this semester; are exploring their fundraising options; will attend the Pecan Festival; and host a Swiss delegation May 21-23.

Aaron Gaddy, C<sup>3</sup>: Members recently had a luncheon for returning students and are looking into purchasing club t-shirts. He had a question about the logo design since it has/is going to be changed. DeBock said the new name change takes effect July 1. Steve Rubert said there is a transitional logo. Consensus was that we put the newest logo on new items and it is alright to display any old logos if they were printed before the new ones.

Mary Bell, Student Senate: Members are researching various methods of on-campus energy conservation, such as a Lights-Out Day. They also are working with the Library to provide books and donation for their new Book Loan program. Ideally, one of each current text book will be housed in the Library for students to read or do homework. These books cannot be checked out of the Library. They are still working with Physical Plant and administration to obtain and place recycle bins in strategic places on campus. And finally, the members are looking at legislation, such as the concealed carry on campus, tuition lock and text book sales outside of campus bookstores.

T.J. Stryker, PTK: Members returned from internationals, as the only chapter in the Arkansas/Oklahoma region listed in the top 100. Officers completed orientation. Members participated in the Relay for Life raising \$300 at the event by selling hot chocolate, smores and face painting. They began their Go Green initiative by setting up three recycle bins at the event, and are hoping to expand the initiative to include a challenge/competition. Members currently are selling roses for Mothers Day as a fundraiser - \$1 each or \$10/ dozen.

Karla Lamunyon, St. Ambassadors: On May 17, members will help with the Okla. Academic Excellence Awards.

Karla Lamunyon, AITP: Members will host the Tulsa Professional AITP Chapter on May 20.

Bo Hudson, RHA: The club provided \$700 worth of prizes for Moonlight Breakfast. There is a meeting tonight and there are currently several open officer positions. They are researching having a Summerfest event.

Tim Kreps, NASA: The new club is looking at t-shirt designs; meet in the HET Building on May 14, 11:30 am.

Terra Beaver, NASA: Added that they are trying to build funds and are planning an Indian Taco Sale. Members also attended a stomp dance at OU.

Devin DeBock, Residential Life: Please tell on-campus students to complete the upcoming survey to assess effects of going tobacco free on residence halls. The goal is to have survey results before summer ends. Bell asked about the smokers/dippers, who were under 21 and enrolled outside the 50-mile-radius rule. They don't have an option of living off campus so they can smoke. DeBock acknowledged that was a current dilemma due to our current policy stating if a student graduates high school outside a 50 mile radius of the college and are not married, they must live on campus during their first and second semesters. This is a civil liberty issue. Force added that some other barriers to Residential Life filling the dorms could be a tuition increase in the fall and that several students had to take the summer off school because they couldn't afford it. As for a tobacco free campus, he mentioned that Okmulgee was the only OSU campus not to go smoke free July 1.

Force also thanked everyone who completed the recent Student Life survey, and mentioned a "Tobacco Free Task Force" is evaluating options for OSU-Okmulgee.
